## THE MARATHON BENEVA DE MONTRÉAL UNVEILS ITS 30TH EDITION!

Montréal, Tuesday, June 7, 2022 – The new team in charge of organizing the Marathon Beneva de Montréal unveiled the program for the event's 30th edition today on the site of the new start line in Parc Jean-Drapeau (from September 23 to 25). Those assembled for the announcement included the event's ambassadors, host, producer and author Alexandra Diaz and Olympian Charles Philibert-Thiboutot, who enthusiastically encouraged members of the public to set personal goals that they will be proud to achieve.

"My father, Serge Arsenault, founded this event in 1979. It was the first major international-calibre marathon ever in the country. Since then, our organization has gone on to produce the only UCI WorldTour-level cycling races in the Americas," said President and CEO Sébastien Arsenault. "This year, the torch is being passed to a second generation of Arsenault who are bringing the same passion for sport and an equally qualified team that reflects our heritage in organizing and promoting Montréal sports gatherings. Sport as a vehicle for personal growth and excellence is part of our DNA, and we intend to deliver an experience that allows participants at all levels to discover the best of themselves."

# MONTRÉAL FROM SHORE TO SHORE, IN 5 CIRCUITS AND 11 EVENTS

"After two years of the pandemic, we are happy to finally welcome this new edition of the Marathon de Montréal, a unifying event that allows Montrealers from all walks of life to be active at their own pace. Sport events like this one encourage the population to get moving, to push themselves and to adopt healthy lifestyle habits, and we are confident that Courons Montréal will organize a quality event that will live up to the expectations of all the participants of this 30th edition," said Caroline Bourgeois, Executive Committee vice-chair for the City of Montréal, responsible for large parks, Mont-Royal, Sports and recreation, Espace pour la vie, Parc Jean-Drapeau and the East End of Montréal.

For the first time, the start of the Sunday races (half-marathon and marathon) will be given at Espace 67 in Parc Jean-Drapeau, and regardless of the distance they cover, runners will be rewarded with a finish worthy of their efforts on the iconic Esplanade du Parc olympique. Between these two iconic city sites, they'll discover Montréal from shore to shore, with the routes winding through its large spaces and parks in 5 boroughs: Ahuntsic-Cartierville, Plateau-Mont-Royal, Rosemont-La Petite-Patrie, Ville-Marie and Villeray-Saint-Michel-Parc-Extension.

Entrants ranging from novices to seasoned athletes can choose among 11 individual and team events. The Marathon Beneva de Montréal has something for runners at every performance level, from families to experienced athletes, with distances including 42.2 km, 21.1 km, 10 km, the Sports Experts 5 km and 1 km. The organizers are also offering race combos for entrants looking for an extra challenge. In addition, they are supporting élite and emerging local athletes by presenting the first edition of the Coupe nationale in collaboration with the Fédération québécoise d'athlétisme.

"I'm delighted to be part of the Marathon Beneva de Montréal and excited about running with the half-marathon entrants from the start line all the way to the finish. As the pacesetter, I'll be helping them keep up the cadence, push themselves and reach their goals," says Charles Philibert-Thiboutot.

"I'm so proud to be an ambassador for this event alongside Charles Philibert-Thiboutot, or should I say way behind him!" **enthuses Alexandra Diaz.** "This is a golden opportunity for me to prove that running is for anyone, at any level. I like to joke that I run like a potato, but a stylish one! So I'm looking to rally everyone who, like me, finds it tough to get out there and run, but are so proud when they get back from a run. On a racecourse, everyone passes me, but I surpass my limits and that's what counts. I hope people will turn out in big numbers to run with us. Let's go!"

## A SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE EVENT

The Marathon's new Run with Heart program sees 27 charitable organizations teaming up with this major sports gathering to maximize their fundraising. This way, the organizers hope to amplify the positive impacts of the event, accentuating that objective with donations on top of the amounts raised by the participating charities.

The event has been certified <u>carbon-neutral</u> by Planetair. It will be offsetting all of its greenhouse-gas emissions and invites all entrants to do the same as well as take part in the event's other ecoresponsibility initiatives when they register.

The Marathon Beneva de Montréal is there for runners well before the start of the race and beyond the finish line as well. Entrants can choose from an array of coaching resources as they <u>prepare for their race</u>. And the Marathon's <u>blog</u> features training programs, tips from experts and information capsules to ensure they arrive fit and ready on race day.
